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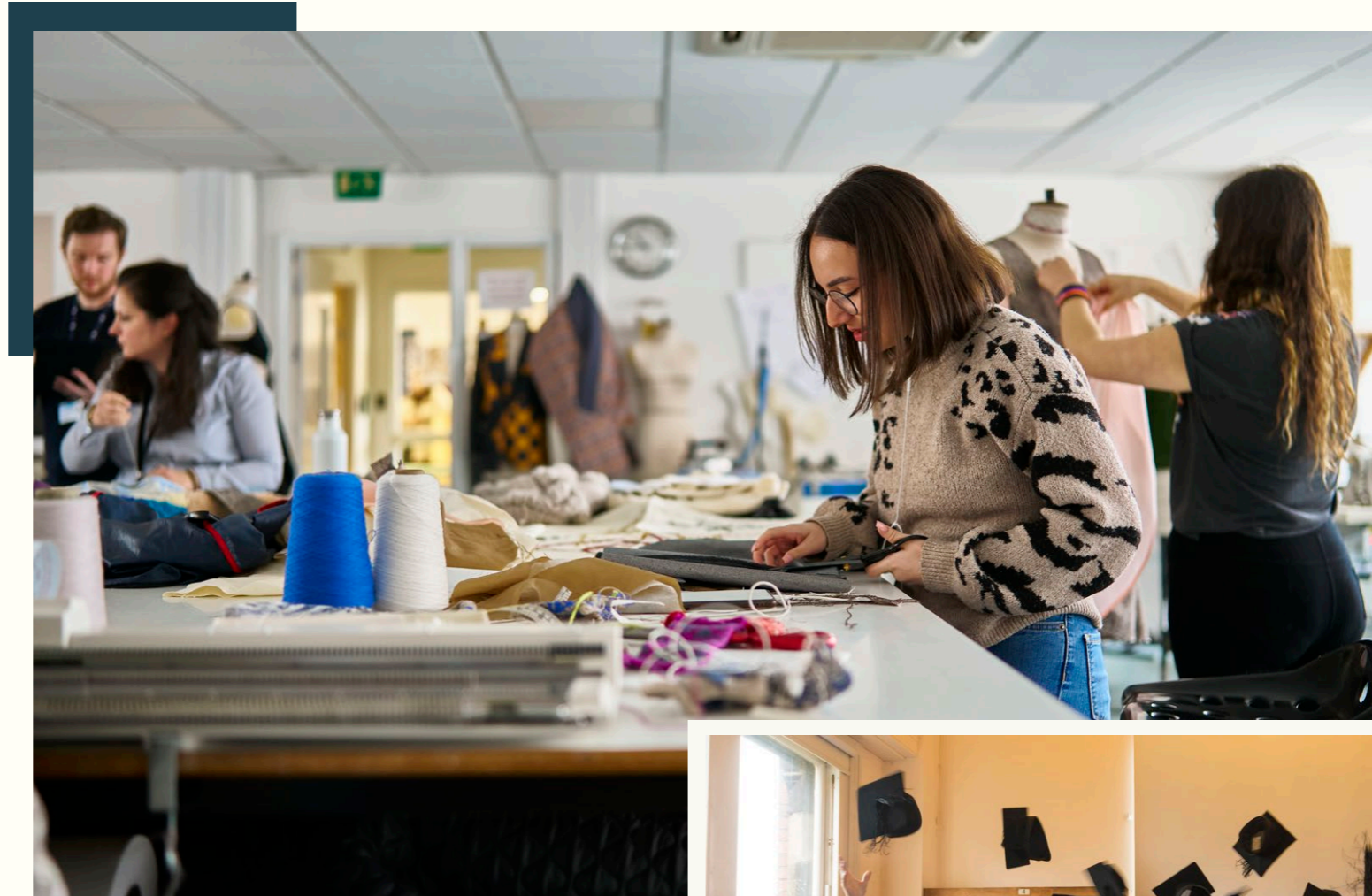

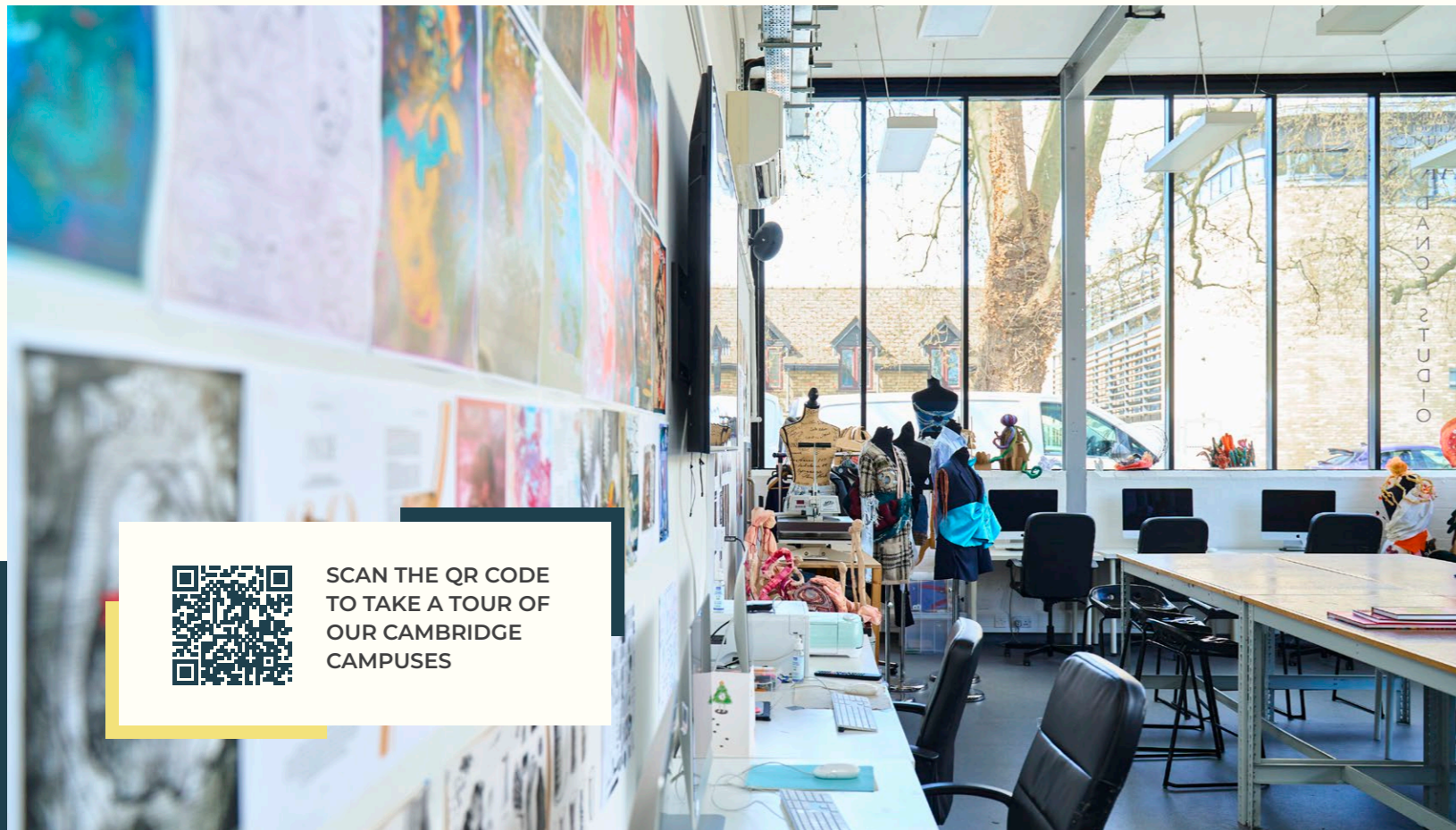

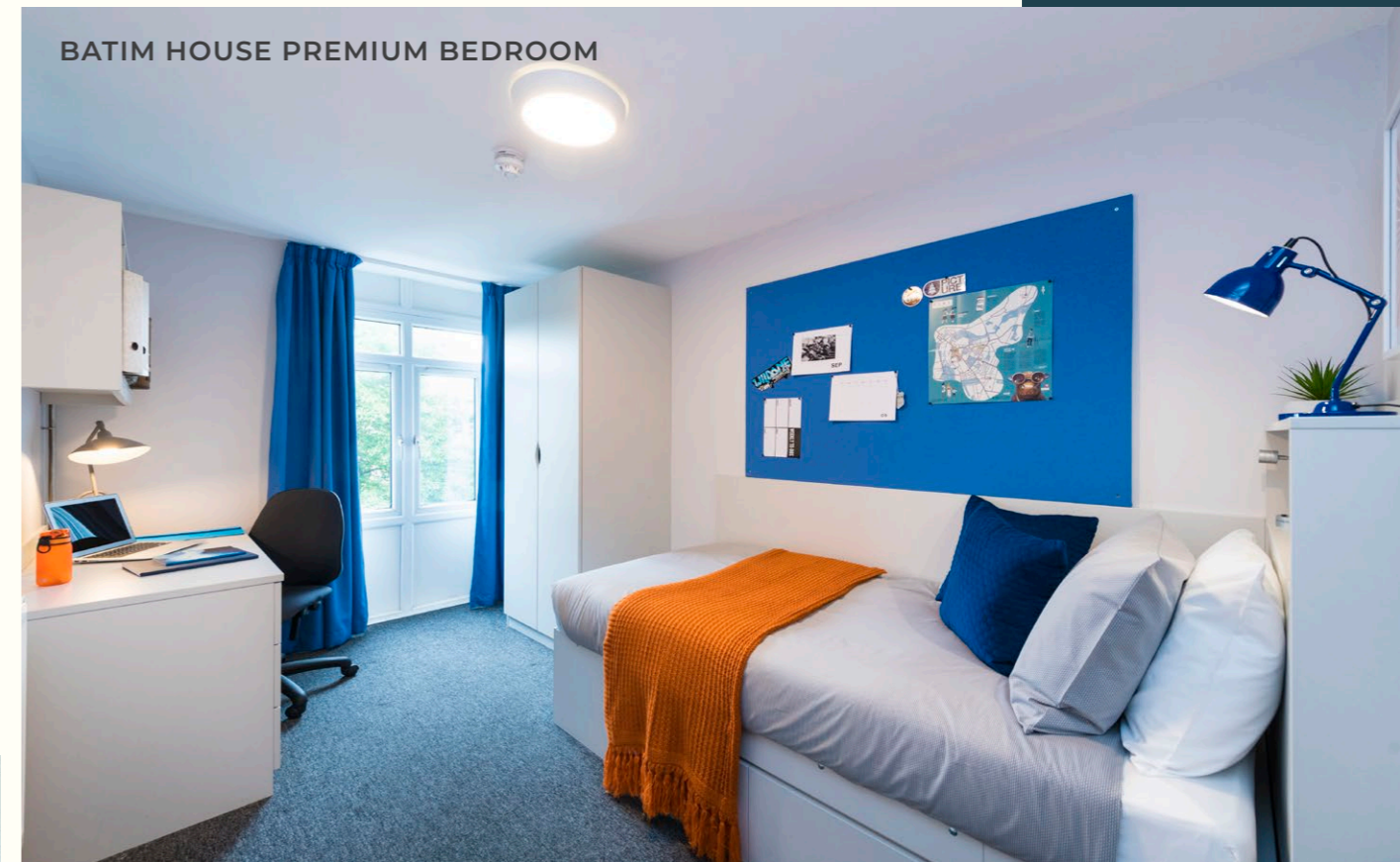

UNDER-18s ACCOMMODATION

Any student below the age of 18 studying at CSVPA will live in our dedicated under-18 halls at Varsity House where we focus on maintaining a safe, secure and carefully monitored environment for our younger students.

We put a strong emphasis on pastoral care at CSVPA and all under-18 boarding is managed by our highly trained team of professional house parents. Students from CSVPA staying at Varsity House will have the joint benefit of living with fellow creative students but also the opportunity to interact with students from our sister school at CATS Cambridge.

OVER-18s ACCOMMODATION

For our older students, we provide a number of accommodation options, but we highly recommend you stay in our halls of residence where you will benefit from being surrounded by other CSVPA students, as well as the on-site dedicated welfare support. The primary accommodation for our over-18 students is at Masters House and Batim House, as well as the dedicated blocks for older students at Varsity House. Designed with your needs in mind, we aim to provide safe and secure accommodation but under more university style conditions, appropriate to our older students.

Our London Studio

Our CSVPA London studio is located within Guildhouse School and both CSVPA and Guildhouse School are part of CATS Global Schools. While you study your programme at the CSVPA London studio, you will be living in an international community that will be part of your exciting day-to-day life.

Our studios are designed to look, feel and operate like those you would work in during your professional career. We make sure you are adept at using all the latest equipment, processes and programmes that the creative industries use. Students have access to our spaces seven days a week and our lecturers provide personalised tuition.

You will be registered as a Guildhouse School student and will therefore have access to their facilities and activities, along with benefitting from access to CSVPA subject specialists, as well as support on your UCAS application.



Living in London

Widely believed to be the culture capital of the world, London has a smorgasbord of cultural delights for every student. From fashion shows and exhibitions to museums, theatre and architecture, London allows students to immerse themselves in the vibrant energy and diversity of this incredible city.

Universities such as Goldsmiths, University of the Arts London, University of Westminster, Slade School of Fine Art at University College London and The Royal College of Art are just some of the creative higher education institutions that can be found there.



Our London Accommodation

For students over the age of 18, there is the possibility of residing in our catered accommodation*, or they can choose to arrange their own accommodation giving them an introduction to independent living in preparation for life at university.

CSVPA London students share accommodation with our sister school, Guildhouse School, who was inspected by the UK Independent Schools Inspectorate under the new inspection regime. The campus achieved top marks, being 100% compliant.

All meals are served on campus for catered students, cooked by our team of onsite chefs. Popular meals include – breaded fish, chicken curry, roast beef with Yorkshire pudding, and stir-fried noodles. Halal, vegetarian and vegan food is available every day.

The right IELTS score and being able to communicate in English with confidence is key for studying, university entry and working within the arts industries.

At CSVPA, we have a dedicated team of English teachers who can support you with your English while you study with us. All students whose English is not at the appropriate level receive at least 5 hours of English tuition a week. You will improve your speaking, listening, reading and writing skills and develop your ability to use English in an academic environment. Our English tutors are experienced in preparing students for the IELTS exam and we have worked hard to build an English programme to meet your needs. Your English will become the passport to your future!

We also have a dedicated Additional Learning Support Coordinator to support students with specific learning difficulties by providing one-on-one support to develop time management and study skills. Throughout your time at CSVPA, we provide the support you need to achieve your learning goals and become the creative you want to be.



Pre-Sessional English Programme

For students who wish to progress to one of our BA, Graduate Diploma or Master's courses but have not met the English language level, we have designed our intensive 12 week Pre-Sessional English Programme.

By taking this programme, you will build the necessary skills in listening, reading, writing and speaking to succeed in your studies. You will learn new vocabulary and develop your understanding of grammar, and how to use them in both academic and everyday situations. There is also a focus on study skills, essay construction, critical thinking, effective notetaking and presentation skills.

By taking our Pre-Sessional English Programme you will:

- Develop your ability to listen to lectures and seminars, take notes effectively and ask questions appropriately
- Participate confidently and appropriately in academic seminars
- Develop your ability to conduct research
- Improve your presentation skills and increase your confidence and accuracy when presenting research
- Improve your reading and listening skills in an academic context
- Improve your ability to express yourself in spoken and written forms in an academic context
- Improve your communication skills to help you live, study and thrive in an English-speaking environment
- Learn more about the UK and its traditions and culture

Success on the Pre-Sessional course is a requirement for progression to your next course of study with CSVPA.

What we look for in a portfolio

When students apply to any of our courses, we are often asked “what should I include in my portfolio?” and “how many pieces do you want to see?” For us it is less about the number of pieces and more about what you put in there. Quality is more important than quantity; show us your best work.

At CSVPA, we are looking for students to demonstrate originality and motivation. You need to show us that you are interested in the subject area you are applying for. If you are passionate about something, show it! It is less about the final piece and more about the thought process you have gone through. Present your research and ideas in sketchbooks or notebooks and let us see a variety of work which demonstrates the skills and experience you have.

Additional things to think about

Your portfolio is your chance to show us your skills and passion. Use the following points as a guide for preparing your portfolio:

- evidence 10-15 pieces of your very best work: quality is more important than quantity
- include both taught and personal work
- demonstrate drawing skills from live observation, not from photos or reference materials
- express your personal ideas and areas of interest (if you're passionate about a certain subject, show it!)
- experiment with a wide range of media and materials
- only use work you have made in the last 18 months: nothing older
- submit it electronically as a compressed Powerpoint document or PDF, or arrange an interview to show your work in person.

Students applying for our Foundation Diploma or Extended Diploma Art and Design programmes at CSVPA need to follow the above guidance, but only submit 5-10 examples of their best finished works.

These should be supported by relevant research and experimentation, and evidence of process. Examples can be taught or personal work, including 2D & 3D works, Photography, GIFs, animations and films. Please ensure external links to media are included within the PDF or Powerpoint file.

What we look for in an audition

When applying to any of the performing arts programmes at CSVPA it is very important to fully understand not only the audition requirements, but also the performance skills the audition panel hopes to see. Auditionees must ensure they submit the requested audition pieces for the relevant area of performing arts, and follow the specified performance requirements.

It is also important to show your strengths as a performer; to communicate your understanding, as well as show your level of technical ability.

At Cambridge School of Visual & Performing Arts we offer a range of diverse and creative summer courses.

If you are passionate about the arts and want to explore your creativity with other young artists then spend the summer with us. Our summer courses are also an excellent way to prepare for full time study at CSVPA.



Accommodation

Our accommodation is located in safe, beautiful surroundings, about 20 minutes' walk from our city centre CSVPA Bridge House campus, and just a short 1 minute walk from our CSVPA Sturton Street campus in Cambridge. We offer a balance between supervision and independence to make sure that you are comfortable and happy in your accommodation.

Meals

Meals are included within the fees and include breakfast, lunch and evening meals all served on campus in the cafeteria.

Evening Activities

Evening activities are compulsory for all students under 18 years old and are a great opportunity to get to know the students on your course and across the other Summer School courses. Activities might include ice skating, bowling, cinema, park social, or a disco.

Every week we organise a different trip, giving you the opportunity to explore UK attractions. Saturday excursions are compulsory for under 18 year old students.
